We're very excited to announce two of South Australia's leading disability organisations – Bedford Group and Phoenix Society – will be coming together to form a stronger, bigger and better disability services provider.

This amalgamation will form the second largest Australian Disability Enterprise in Australia, delivering employment to more than 1300 people with disability across 14 sites in SA and NSW as well as offering school to work transition, Day Options, housing and nationally accredited training qualifications to hundreds more people with disability.

"Bedford and Phoenix have more than 120 years of combined experience and credibility in changing lives for people with disability. We are passionate about what we do, and we do it well," says Bedford Chief Executive Sally Powell.

"However, the introduction of the National Disability Insurance Scheme is going to bring about significant change. While it means

more choice for people with disability and their families, it also means dramatically increased competition in the sector," she said.

"To ensure that we can continue to be here for people with disability and their families, the Bedford-Phoenix amalgamation will create a stronger organisation that is better positioned to provide high quality services for the long term.

"It's the right decision to ensure we can continue to offer the experience and expertise that new entrants to the market will struggle to match."

Phoenix Society CEO Paul Stevenson said the amalgamation represented the bringing together of two like-minded organisations.

"The culture, heritage and brands of both organisations – Bedford and Phoenix – will be preserved in the amalgamation and our employees, staff and stakeholders will notice little or no change," he said.

"The amalgamation will allow us to introduce new and

improved facilities and work environments, develop our professional capabilities and offer more choice and even better outcomes for people with disability.

"We want to ensure we are here for the long haul for people with disability and their families. They know us, they trust us and they need us to continue to care."

Changes under the amalgamation will start to take place in early 2015 so watch this space for more exciting updates going forward.

Abilities for All

We believe that everyone has the right to a good education. This is why Bedford is very proud to offer its 'Abilities for All' program helping people who have faced significant barriers to learning, succeed in an academic environment. At this year's 'Abilities for All' graduation 197 students from across Adelaide and regional South Australia were commended and rewarded for some truly remarkable accomplishments.

Held on 22 July at Bedford's Panorama site, proud families and friends came together to celebrate their loved ones' outstanding efforts. Students received Statements of Attainment or Certificates in a number of fields including Information, Digital Media and Technology, Community Service, Retail Services, Landscaping, Disability and Employment Services.

We were very honoured to have His Excellency Rear Admiral Kevin Scarce, Governor of South Australia, attend the ceremony to present certificates to graduates.

A couple of the standout students were chosen to speak at the ceremony, highlighting the impact

Bedford's training programs has on their lives.

You may remember Daron Elliot from previous editions of our magazine. Having already completed his Certificate II in Community Services, Daron then went on to obtain his Certificate III in Disability as well as a Certificate III in Employment Services. His determination to continually learn and overcome some rather challenging personal circumstances is nothing short of inspiring.

"I have been on an extraordinary journey since beginning training with Abilities for All. I was a man with very limited choices, with many barriers in front of him. I was down in confidence and feeling very defeated by life itself. Now I have control over what direction my life will take and a hopefulness of providing a life my family deserves," says Daron.

"While studying my Certificate III in Disability I unfortunately had a heart attack and found I had Type 2 Diabetes. My training actually had a beneficial impact on the way I dealt with and arranged for services I needed.

"When I enrolled in Certificate III in Employment Services I was looking for training that was going to complement my qualifications in Community Services and Disability. Now I have completed this qualification, I am looking forward to using what I've achieved for the purpose of helping and motivating others. I have a passion to help others in whatever way I can and the training I have received has broadened my skills, confidence and ability to achieve these goals."

There are a number of people involved in this vocational education initiative who are responsible for changing the lives of people like Daron. None of this would be possible without the dedication of Bedford's trainers, the Community Centres of SA and the Government of South Australia's Department of State Development.

Bedford's 'Abilities for All' program has run successfully for the past decade and we aim to keep providing this unique training service into the future.

Being a very outgoing individual and stopping to talk to anyone he walks past, we were thrilled to have Lee as one of our City – Bay ambassadors, raising funds to help all of his friends at Bedford.

On the day of the big race Lee was accompanied by Bedford staff, family, supporters and our friends at NAB who all flew the flag for Bedford sporting orange apparel and raising money for our cause.

There were also a number of Bedford volunteers who were there to cook a big BBQ breakfast for all of our walkers and runners. Thank you to Transfield Services for supplying the big hearty breakfast.

We're very proud to say Lee completed his walk in 2 hours and 15 minutes and he looks forward to competing again next year to try and beat this time.





traditional treats – christmas pudding



Ingredients

- 375g sultanas
- 375g currants
- 375g raisins
- 125g mixed peel
- Finely grated rind/zest of one lemon
- 2 grated cooking apples (unpeeled)
- 250g butter (chilled and grated)
- Extra butter for lightly greasing the pudding basins
- 375g (5 cups) soft white breadcrumbs
- 250g soft brown sugar
- 6 eggs
- 1/2 cup plain flour
- 1tsp ground cloves
- 1tsp cinnamon
- Good pinch of salt
- 2Tbsp of brandy or rum if desired

Serves: 4 – 6 people

Prep: 45 mins / Cooking: 11 hours

Method

1. Prepare 2 pudding basins by lightly greasing the insides with butter.
2. Cut raisins and mixed peel into even sized small pieces.
3. Place the breadcrumbs in a large bowl. Sift flour, salt and spices over breadcrumbs.
4. Add the grated butter, apple, lemon rind, mixed fruits and sugar.
5. Beat eggs until frothy and add rum or brandy if using.
6. Add to the other ingredients and mix thoroughly. Mixture should be fairly soft.
7. Spoon into the prepared basins and cover tightly with greaseproof paper, foil or cloth.
8. Secure tightly with string.
9. Place in a large pot of simmering water (to about $\frac{3}{4}$ of the way up the sides of the pudding basin) for 7 hours. Top up with more boiling water as needed (pop a lid loosely on top).
10. Remove and allow to cool then refrigerate until needed.
11. On the day place in a pot of simmering water for four hours (filled to $\frac{3}{4}$ of the side of the basin) and serve.
12. Serve hot with custard, cream, brandy sauce or ice-cream.

Tim Cahalan



beyond bedford

A number of our readers would have seen stories in previous editions of Changing Lives about Bedford employee Tim Cahalan. He has always been an avid follower of the South Australian political scene and passionate about the rights of people with disability.

While working in the Bedford Packaging department Tim expressed his ambitions to take the next step in his career.

"In 2009 I went to an event in Canberra, the National Student Leadership Forum. That gave me the inspiration to do something else. Since then I've been trying to find work outside of Bedford in administration and government," says Tim.

Knowing Tim strove to achieve more, Bedford took steps to develop his skills and ensure he succeeded in his goal.

"In Tim's case, we worked on transition from a packaging environment to an office role, so we got him some work experience in an office environment. We looked into some short courses in order to round out his skill set and be considered for a traineeship," says Bedford Chief Executive Sally Powell.

All of the hard work paid off when Tim was successful in obtaining a trainee position in the Office of the Honourable Tony Piccolo MP, Minister for Disabilities.

"In the months leading up to getting this job I received great support and help from my Personnel Officer Leesa Hill and also from Sally Powell. I probably wouldn't have been prepared for it once I started if they hadn't supported me and prepped me for this," says Tim.

Bedford is very proud to provide unique job roles within our own organisation and also to provide the skills and opportunities that can help people with disability achieve open employment.
